

Classroom Listening, Discussion, and Activity Guide

Background

Questions for Reflection and Discussion

- 1. What are some man-made threats to our national parks?
- How can we protect natural areas from being spoiled by the people who visit them?
- 3. What are some beautiful nature sites you have visited? What makes them beautiful?
- 4. How would you feel seeing the earth in miniature from high up in an airplane?

Activities

Write your own poem, song, or short story about a national park or nature site you have visited or would like to visit.

Make your own painting or drawing of a national park or nature site that you have visited or would like to visit.

Speech-Language Objectives

Goal: Improve language processing and production skills.

<u>Objective 1</u>: The student will understand and express vocabulary related to synonyms.

<u>Sample Task</u> - Provide synonyms for the following words: *grand*, *reduced*, *thrilling*, *beauty*.

Objective 2: The student will understand and express vocabulary related to correct usage of new vocabulary words in sentence formation.

<u>Sample Task</u> – Define the following words and use each one in a sentence: plains, canyons, abounds, spirit.

Objective 3: The student will understand and express vocabulary related to figurative language.

<u>Sample Task</u> – Answer the following questions: How is the phrase *not like a bird* in a cage used figuratively? What does the cage symbolize?

Objective 4: The student will understand and express the structure of analogies.

Sample Task - Fill in the blank. In this song, an analogy is drawn between a person stuck in an airplane and a bird trapped in a ____ (cage).

Objective 5: The student will understand and express similarities and differences.

<u>Sample Task</u> – Answer the following questions: In what ways are valleys and canyons similar? In what ways are they different?

<u>Objective 6</u>: The student will complete written language activities chosen by the Speech-Language Pathologist such as creative writing activities.

<u>Sample Task</u> – Write a poem, song, or short story about a national park or other nature site that you have visited or would like to visit.

Goal: Improve auditory perceptual abilities.

Objective 1: The student will identify and supply rhyming words.

<u>Sample Task</u> – Answer the following questions: What words rhyme with *green*? Which of the following words rhymes with *rains*? *beige*, *cage*, *plains*

<u>Objective 2</u>: The student will name beginning sounds of words presented orally. <u>Sample Task</u> – Answer the following questions: What is the beginning sound of where? What is the beginning sound of though?

Objective 3: The student will name middle sounds of words presented orally.

Sample Task — Name the middle sound in each of the following words: place, brown, just, sight.

Objective 4: The student will repeat sentences of increasing word length.

Sample Task - Repeat the following sentence: Someday I will walk there, not just see it from the sky.

Objective 5: The student will unscramble sentences presented orally.

Sample Task – Unscramble the following sentences: snow-capped There mountains are. calls to The beauty me of America.

Objective 6: The student will recall from memory a series of 3 or 4 unrelated words.

<u>Sample Task</u> - Repeat the following set of words: *never*, *window*, *mountain*, *willing*.
