Now what's the difference you might say, Between upper and lower case? Well you can see it plain as day, It's written all over the page. You see, Upper case letters all stretch high from the bottom to the top. Lower case letters stretch high, swing low, or hug the middle. They just won't stop! Alphabet Extension Upper & Lower Case Recognition Bridging Activity

For full page versions, open 06_Upper_Lower_Case_Recognition_Bridging_Activity.pdf file.

Instructions: Print each page on $8\frac{1}{2}$ "x11" card stock and duplicate one set for each child. Have each child trace each letter and then creatively color the upper case and lower case letter pairs matching. Cut along outside edges of each letter box to make letter flash cards. Mix cards up and find letter pairs or turn the letters over and play the memory pairs game.
