

Basic Math Application – Subtracting One

Lesson Objective: Children will learn the concept of subtracting "1 less" from 10 to 0, learn to count backward from 10, and that subtraction is the opposite of addition (i.e. "the reverse operation").



Basic Math Applications Subtracting One

"One Less Penny Blues"

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Interactive Dialogue

- Line up ten children in the front of the room and count them out loud together as a class. Then ask one to sit down, then count again. Continue until there are no more children. Emphasize that you are subtracting one each time.
- Using the Subtracting One Visual Aids, show the large pocket and
 put the ten pennies in the pocket counting one by one. Then have
 a child come up and take one penny out of the pocket saying "ten
 minus one is nine." Continue until all the pennies are gone.
- Then using the Visual Aids show the equation on the board (using the blue oval with ten pennies, the minus sign, then the red oval with one penny, then the blue oval with nine pennies. Continue demonstrating with the pennies ovals and as the class begins to catch on replace the pennies ovals with the numeral ovals.
- Have the children color and assemble their own pockets and pennies found in the Subtracting One Bridging Activity, so they can practice subtracting one with their neighbor.
- Listen to the song One Less Penny Blues and have the children observe as you do the movements.
- Invite the children to learn the song and movements. Walk the children through the movements in short segments. Have them repeat the movements as you the say the words to the song.
- Play the song and have the children sing and do movements. Repeat.

Related Activities

- 1. Give the children each 10 apple slices. Have the children count the apples after they eat each slice.
- 2. When handing out papers to the children count the total then count down saying "minus one equals _____" each time you hand out the paper.
- Play musical chairs. Everytime you remove a chair count the chairs out loud emphasizing "minus one."
 - 4. Go on a walk and have each child collect 10 items they find. Bring the itmes (rocks, leaves, etc.) back to the class and parctice 10-1 = 9 items down to zero.







Instructions:


Print each page on 8½"x11" card stock, cut each oval out and laminate if desired. Attach a magnet strip or Velcro on of each oval for use on a magnetic or felt board. Start by using the penny cards along with the minus and equal signs to build penny subtraction equations. Gradually replace the penny cards with the matching number cards to build number line equations (i.e. begin by replacing the single red penny with the red numeral and go through the number sequence, then use a number card for the solution, finally use all number cards).













Subtracting One (Visual Aids #2)

Instructions:

Print red pocket parts on 8½"x11" transparencies, cut along dashed lines and tape four pieces together. Attach a magnet strip or Velcro at the upper corners and along the bottom edge of assembled pocket for use on a magnetic or felt board. Print penny pages on 8½"x11" card stock, cut each penny out and laminate if desired. Use pennies by counting each penny as it is dropped behind pocket transparency. Remove one penny at a time from the pocket and practice counting how many pennies are left in the pocket.
