

Water Creatures - Ocean Food Chain

The "Gulp Gulp" Song

Lesson Objective: Children will discuss previous knowledge about how fish live in water, not on land, and about the food chain of the ocean.

Interactive Dialogue

- Encourage the children to share what they know about fish. (Answers will vary.)
- Share the many pictures from the Water Creatures Visual Aids and talk about the uniqueness of each creature.
- · Focus dialogue on where fish can be found.
- · Explore with the children why fish can't live on land.
- Introduce the Ocean Food Chain Visual Aids. Place these on the display board to help teach the lesson and the song.
- Ask, "What do you think fish eat?"
- Elicit responses from the children about which fish they think might eat others. Why?
- Explain the concept of food chain and why it is important.
- Give each child one of the ocean animal necklaces (from the Ocean Food Chain Bridging Activity file).
- Listen to the song The "Gulp Gulp" Song and have the children observe as you do the movements.
- Invite the children to learn the song and movements. Walk the children through the movements in short segments. Have them repeat the movements as you say the words to the song.
- Play the song and have the children sing and do movements. Repeat.

Related Activities

- 1. Play "Sharks & Fish" with the children. One person is the shark, the others are fish and play "tag."
- 2. During clean up, pretend to be sharks and have the sharks pick up trash. Explain that this is a helpful job sharks do for the ocean -- they clean the ocean by eating dead ocean life.
- 3. Explore the web by searching for ocean predators. Read about them together.
- 4. Visit an aquarium in your area. Look for ocean predators.


Visual Aids

Bridging Activity


For full page versions, insert Cool Creatures Companion Data CD and open the **Super Smarties/ Ocean Food Chain** folder.

Instructions:

- a) Print as many colored water creature pages on $8\frac{1}{2}$ "x11" card stock as needed for each child to have one. Cut along dashed lines, laminate if desired. Punch holes where indicated, reinforce holes with reinforcement labels and insert a ribbon for necklace tie to use with song.

 Or
- b) Print fish pages on $8\frac{1}{2}$ "x11" card stock from the included blackline master, one for each child. Use this fish as a coloring, cutting and assembling activity for the children and use as manipulative with the song.
